Management, employees, and safety representatives are collaborating to create a good and safe work environment, and our safety committees and chemical group are also involved. We also ensure that we have knowledge of risks as well as clear procedures for critical operations.

Through BIM's wellness work, we also stimulate and create the conditions for our employees to influence their mental and physical health through their lifestyle and participation in various wellness activities with their own power.
