

 Hosted at an Educational Centre, the team spent time with the families doing fun activities including rollerblading and playing football. The team rented a bouncy castle and made dumplings for dinner with the kids and their mothers.
- Donated funds to a registered foundation to help with buying an ambulance, first aid kits and medicine for soldiers.
- Collected hygiene products, baby diapers and other daily essential items and donated them to Polska Akcja Humanitarna, who distributed the goods to Ukrainians in need who are sheltering with children in basements or in metro stations.

Special thanks to all those who have welcomed Ukrainians into their homes, looked after them like they were their own and spent time and effort to organise jobs and sort out the necessary paperwork.
